When Jesus came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.' And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.'

Let us give thanks to God for Elizabeth's ability to be a champion of the poor, and let us pray that we may all strive for social justice.

Almighty God, we give thee thanks for all who work for the relief of those who suffer, and we pray that thou wilt hasten the time when no man shall live in contentment while he knows that his neighbour has need. Inspire in us and in all people the consciousness that we are not our own but thine and our neighbours'; for his sake who prayed that we might be one in him, thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Let us give thanks to God for Elizabeth's writings and for their prophetic voice, and let us give thanks for those who speak where others listen.

Almighty God, who hast proclaimed thine eternal truth by the voice of prophets and evangelists and the skill of those who write: direct and bless, we beseech thee, those who in our generation speak where many listen, and write what many read; that they may play their part in making the heart of the people wise, its mind sound, and its will righteous, to the honour of Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

All these prayers and praises let us offer to the Father in the prayer that Jesus Christ has taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
